

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS – ALABAMA COLLEGES 2017-2018

FOUR YEAR INSTITUTIONS:

Generally look for 21 minimum ACT (1000 SAT) with 3.0 OVERALL GPA, with all applications considered on an individual basis. Writing portion of ACT is no longer required. Algebra II is required. 1 yr Foreign Language is required. Must apply online or download forms. Minimums to qualify for automatic scholarships are 25 ACT and 3.5 GPA. Students must complete the scholarship application once accepted. Scholarship deadline is December 15.

20 ACT (950 SAT(old) or 1020(redesigned)) & 2.75 overall GPA. 17 core credits required with 4 yrs English, 3 yrs Social Science, 3 yrs Science (including 2 labs), 3 yrs math (Algebra I & higher), 1 yr foreign language, and 3 additional academic courses. Priority deadline for admission is June 1. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 20 ACT and 3.5 overall GPA or 24 ACT and 3.0 GPA. Scholarship deadline is December 1. December ACT score will be considered for scholarship if student is already admitted and requests UAB to pull their score. Honors College admission offered to students who meet criteria: 28 ACT and 3.5 or higher GPA. Honors College Specialized Program application deadline is January 15.

20 ACT and a 2.9 GPA are the minimum requirements for admissions. Engineering requires a minimum 21 composite on the ACT. Foreign Language is not required. A 25 on the ACT and 3.0 GPA are the minimum for MERIT BASED Scholarships (accept updated ACT scores through August 1).

Alabama State University uses a sliding scale to consider applicants for admission. In regards to SAT scores, we only evaluate the critical reading and math scores. Generally, applicants with higher GPAs and ACT test scores may be accepted with lower ACT/SAT scores, while applicants with lower GPAs may be accepted with higher ACT/SAT scores. To be considered for admission, you must earn a diploma from an accredited high school and meet the following criteria according to the sliding scale:

3.00 – 3.49	16/ 870-909
3.50 or higher	15/ 830-869

Admission application opens on September 1. Applicants are reviewed on an individual basis. The average GPA for students admitted to the 2016 freshman class was a 3.83 and the middle 50% range for the ACT was 24-30 while SAT was a 1090-1350. Writing portion of ACT is not required. Students are welcome to discuss their credentials with the admissions counselor, Kali Tucker. She can be reached at 334-734-3381 or by email at kali.tucker@auburn.edu. Minimums for merit based scholarships are 28 ACT (or comparable SAT) and 3.5 GPA. December 1st is the deadline to complete AUSOM (**scholarship application**). Students must complete AUSOM to be considered for any scholarships Auburn has to offer. Scholarships are not guaranteed if AUSOM is completed after December 1st.

Full Admissions- Minimum 18 ACT or 860 SAT score (taken before March 2016) or 940 SAT (taken March 2016 or after) and 2.3 GPA. Conditional Admissions (Bridge students)- a minimum 17 ACT or 820 SAT score (taken before March 2016) or 900 SAT (taken March 2016 or after) and 2.3 GPA is required. Algebra II is not required. Foreign Language is not required. ONLINE application is free. Minimum qualifications for scholarships are 18 ACT and 2.5 GPA. Scholarship deadline is March 1.

Average ACT is a 26.5 and average grade point average is 3.70. Applications are available via BSC online application or Common App. Essay required, recommendation form and letter, resume (not required but preferred), transcript and application fee of \$50. Application fee waived if application is received by our Early Action deadline. Early Decision (binding) deadline is November 1, Early Action (non-binding) deadline is November 15, and regular admission deadline is February 1. Merit scholarships are awarded based on where student falls in the BSC scholarship grid (which can be found here: <http://www.bsc.edu/admission/scholarships.cfm>) as well as a holistic approach. Evaluations begin November 15. All ACT/SAT scores sent by the Regular Action deadline will be considered. ACT and SAT scores are super-scored; however, BSC also has a test-optional application process. Students are encouraged to apply test-optional if their standardized tests don't adequately represent their academic caliber. Students are encouraged to apply for need based financial aid by completing the FAFSA.

20 ACT (940 SAT) and 2.5 GPA for unconditional acceptance. 19 ACT (900 SAT) and 2.75 GPA or an 18 ACT (860) and 3.0 GPA for conditional acceptance. We use the GPA that is calculated on the high school transcript and we now super score the ACT. Two math courses above Algebra I are strongly recommended. Foreign Language not required, but recommended. Minimum to qualify for scholarships is acceptance to the college.

High School diploma or GED certificate required with at least a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale. 20 ACT-unconditional acceptance; 18-19 ACT-student must take LS 104 Learning Skills class for remediation. SAT: 950 or above-unconditional acceptance; 870-940-conditional acceptance. Algebra II not required for admission, but recommended. Foreign Language not required. Scholarship deadline is March 1 (February is last ACT considered w/scores being sent directly to JSU) and minimums to qualify are 23 ACT/1100 SAT and a 3.0 GPA for automatic scholarships and 20 ACT/950 SAT and 3.0 GPA for Leadership Scholarships. Students must apply for admission and be accepted before applying for scholarships or housing.

18 ACT (870 SAT) and 2.0 academic GPA. If not meeting either of these requirements, you can apply to the Admissions Committee for possible Conditional Admission approval. Algebra II not required, but recommended. Foreign Language not required, but recommended. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 20 ACT and 2.5 GPA. ACT scores through June will be considered for scholarships.

Unconditional admittance given with a high school diploma. Those who do not make at least a 16 on each category of the ACT will fall into the Jump Start Program. Algebra II is not required. Foreign Language is not required. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 18 ACT and 3.0 GPA.

21 ACT and 2.75 GPA for unconditional acceptance. They consider lower scores for conditional acceptance (18 minimum, subject to change for the 2017-2018 year)---contact admissions counselor. Algebra II is not required. Foreign Language is not required. Minimum scholarship requirements are 20 ACT and 2.75 GPA, and they consider ACT scores up until freshman year begins. "\$2,000 visit day scholarships are available to each student who attends a visit day before *May 1 of senior year (*with possibility of extension) . RSVP to attend one of these days on the UMobile website at www.umobile.edu/visit or contact your enrollment counselor for more information."

20 ACT (SAT 950), 2.5 overall GPA. Algebra II not required for admission, but recommended. Foreign Language not required for admission, but recommended. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 23 ACT and 3.0 GPA or 22 ACT and 3.5 GPA. The Presidential Honors Scholarship (students with a 30 ACT/3.0 GPA) is now \$9,000.00 per year. (Previously \$7,500.00 per year) For scholarship consideration, we super-score the ACT.

Unconditional admittance with an 18 ACT (940 SAT), GPA of 2.25 on overall unweighted with a total of 13 core units. Conditional admission with: 16 on ACT (860 on SAT), at least 11 core units (4 English, 2 Math, 2 Natural or Physical Science, 3 Social Studies), and GPA of 2.00 on overall unweighted. Algebra II is not required. Foreign Language is not required. Minimums to qualify for ACADEMIC scholarships are 20 ACT and 3.0 GPA. Scholarship deadline is December 15, 2017, after which awards are based on fund availability.

Application components include: application, \$40 application fee, one academic letter of recommendation, official ACT/SAT score, high school GPA, and personal essay. The average range for the ACT is 23-29, SAT is 1080-1320, and GPA is 3.48-4.0. Algebra II is required. Foreign Language is recommended, but not required. The application committee values test scores and GPA, but takes a holistic view in considering a student for admission and scholarships. There is a separate scholarship application for leadership and presidential scholarship consideration. Revisions to the application and updated test scores will be accepted through the December 1th deadline for merit-based scholarship consideration.

19 ACT with a 2.5 GPA. Algebra 1, II are required. Foreign Language not required, but may be used as an advanced elective. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 23 ACT and 3.0 GPA. Priority scholarship deadline is December 1 but funds are distributed until exhausted.

They work off rolling admissions and the application fee is waived for students applying online, either using the Common Application or through the Spring Hill website. Official ACT or SAT test scores, official transcript, letter of recommendation from a teacher or counselor. They do superscore the ACT/SAT. Recommended 20 ACT or 930 SAT and 3.0 GPA. Average of last year's incoming class was between a 22-27 ACT and a 3.4 GPA. If you have below a 20 ACT, then they will look closely at your GPA and rigor of high school courses for possible admission. Algebra II is required for admission. Foreign Language is not required. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 20 ACT and 2.5 GPA.

Unconditional admittance given with a 20 ACT (950 SAT) and a 2.0 overall GPA. Conditional admittance is given with a 17-19 ACT (830 SAT) and 2.5 GPA. Foreign Language is not required for admission. Minimums to qualify for scholarships are 23 ACT and 3.0 GPA. Scholarships are competitive and students will apply. They must meet the requirements specified for each scholarship as well as submit an essay to be eligible. The last national ACT testing date considered for Leadership, Chancellor's and Millennium scholarships is October. *TROY does offer a residual ACT on campus (Students need to contact the recruiter to gain more specifics on how to register for the residual test)* Scholarship application deadline is December 1st.
